

Our Nursery



Our wonderful nursery provision offers 15 and 30 hour places contact the school office to arrange a visit.

Nursery session times: 15 hours provision Monday – Friday (8.50 am - 11.50 am) or Monday – Friday (12.20 pm – 3.20 pm)

Nursery session times: 30 hours provision Monday – Friday (8.50 am – 3.20 pm)

There is a small daily cost to cover lunch if you wish to have a school meal (£2.20 each day) or you can send a packed lunch from home.

Our Aims

School Day

It is crucial that all pupils are punctual for school and that they attend school each day.

Reception, Key Stage 1 & 2:

School day starts at 9.00 am (gates open 8.45 am) School day finishes at 3.20 pm

The government currently provides free school meals to all children in Reception and Key Stage 1.

Free school meals are also available to older children whose parents are in receipt of certain benefits. If you believe your child is eligible for Free School Meals, please ask for information from the school office, even if your child is in Early Years or Key Stage 1.



Our Curriculum


- Purple sweatshirts or purple cardigans

Our award winning in-house catering team Chadwick's Kitchen, provide catering services across the Trust.

We use fresh ingredients to prepare healthy and nutritionally balanced meals each day. The majority of our menus are homemade by our chefs in our kitchens.

Staff are trained to accommodate medical diets and work in partnership with parents to ensure these needs are met. As part of the Trust's commitment to sustainability, we regularly review food miles and continue to work to reduce food waste.

Parents/Carers can pay for school meals using ParentPay.

Pupils entitled to free meals are allowed to purchase food to the value of a free school meal allowance daily.
