Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to all the children and staff for their very positive attitudes as we return to our community over the past few weeks. The start of a new school year always brings a sense of hope and anticipation, though it can also be a little tiring for our younger ones as we settle back into routines after the summer break.

I'm delighted to say that our community has had a very strong start, with high expectations around attendance and punctuality. Thank you for supporting this and ensuring that our children are in school no later than 9:00am. Please remember that our school doors open at 8:45am, and a free breakfast is available for any child from 8:30am in the school hall.

Catering Excellence

One of the things that has struck me since joining our community is the outstanding quality of our school catering. We are blessed with an excellent team led by our chef, Peter Balchin. You can view our weekly menu via our <u>Trust's catering page.</u> In time, we hope to offer parents the opportunity to sample a school lunch too.

Free School Meals

The overwhelming majority of children take up the option of a school lunch. To help promote this further, on 2nd October, the kitchen will hold a special event—American Day—featuring a variety of burgers, goujons and bites; skinny fries; sweetcorn and "banging beans." For dessert, children can choose between American pancakes or cookies.

Please support the day, and feel free to send your child for a one-off taster experience. I've attached the poster and a free school meal application form.

Signing up for free school meals not only provides your child with a healthy, balanced lunch each day—it also unlocks vital funding (known as Pupil Premium) that directly benefits their education and wellbeing. In Sunderland, all children in Reception, Year 1, and Year 2 automatically receive free meals under the Universal Free School Meal scheme. For older children, families may be eligible if they receive benefits such as:

- Universal Credit (with a household income under £7,400)
- Income Support
- Child Tax Credit (without Working Tax Credit and income under £16,190)

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance Sunderland City Council now automatically enrols families receiving Housing Benefit or Council Tax Support. However, if you think you've been missed, it's important to apply via the Together for Children Family Portal.
